The New Testament Church Preparing for Change #6 – <u>Kingdom Priorities</u> June 2, 2024 - Pastor Paul Jehle

I Preparing for Change – God is bringing a correction, reset, adjustment, to our nation/culture...

- A. There is great change coming and most Americans are aware something must happen...
 - 1. An economic reset is coming, and rising boldness of evil could have tyrannical consequences
 - 2. We have become so polarized, many are concerned for how we could ever unite...
- B. In this series we have considered the early church recipe (Acts 2:42) for changing their culture...
 - 1. In the face of tyranny, they focused on seeing the eventual triumph of God's Kingdom!
 - 2. In the face of polarization, they cultivated koinonia communion, forming a deep covenant!
 - 3. With no earthly appeal, they prayed "without ceasing," bringing a measure of heaven to earth!
- C. We have now considered two of four strategic areas of influence highlighting the tribe of Issachar
 - 1. The "Sons of Issachar" a unique tribe assembling for battle 1st Chronicles 12:32 (1000 BC)
 - 2. We have learned that the tribe of Issachar
 - a. Were those content to farm at home, learning humble wisdom to give direction
 - b. Issachar also were those who learned to staying in their sphere of influence
 - 1. Deuteronomy 33:18-19 (1400 BC) Issachar commended for remaining "in their tents"
 - 2. They called people to the mountain (kingdom) for righteousness... trusting God that He would bring all the gifts necessary to get the job done!

II Kingdom Priorities - how to avoid "majoring in the minors;" keeping the main thing the main thing!

- A. The tribe of Issachar understood that maintaining kingdom priorities produced unity
 - 1. Judges 5:15 1236 BC Deborah was the 4th Judge during Israel's peak of influence
 - a. The "Hebrew Republic" was a time when Israel was the freest nation in the ancient world
 - b. She had a decentralized government and Judges as civil magistrates were restrained by law
 - c. When the people did not follow God (no self-govt), the Judge became the deliverer...
 - d. As we move along these 400 years, the Judges become more powerful and corrupt...
 - 2. Issachar was not a tribe with prolific physical warriors but they were people of the Torah
 - a. In 1800 BC prophesied to be a people of tillage and tribute farming (studying) at home
 - b. In 1400 they were highlighted as "remaining in their tents" staying in their lane
 - c. Now, in 1236 BC, they were challenged with keeping the priorities of the Kingdom
 - 1. After 80 years of peace, Israel was no longer ready to defend themselves (see 5:8)
 - 2. They backslid and were taken captive to Jabin king of Canaan, in Hazor...
 - d. Deborah's rule as a Judge revealed the need for an eternal perspective (Judges 5:
 - e. Issachar's princes raised a fighting force under the command of Barak in the valley!
 - f. They had "resolves of heart" commitment at the deepest level to preserve the kingdom
 - 1. Kingdom means what is eternal God sees "the end from the beginning" (Isaiah 46:10)
 - 2. The "little foxes" (Song of Solomon 2:15) spoil the vine soft choices of compromise
 - 3. When the enemy comes in like a flood, the Lord raises up a standard (Isaiah 59:19-20)
- B. Matthew 6:33 Seek first the Kingdom "let's keep the main thing the main thing"
 - 1. The Kingdom means eternal things the highest purpose the ultimate goal...
 - a. As individuals, we examine ourselves are we ready for *eternity*? (receive the gospel)
 - b. As individuals, we need to rehearse the *purpose* for which God has us alive at this time!
 - c. As parents, we prepare our children with *character* to avoid making them soft...
 - d. As churches, we want to lift a standard to prepare us to sacrifice for Kingdom influence
 - 1. We may need to move out of our comfort zone, yet do so for "the common good"
 - 2. We can go into the valley the place of turmoil and help lift each other's spirits
 - 2. "All these things will be added unto you" God knows what you need and will supply it!
 - 3. Let us continue to declare Deborah's song Hear O Ye Kings!
